
WELCOME TO OPEN BOOK: A FESTIVAL FOR READERS


Mango Languages: The library's free language learning app, Mango, deepens your connections with family, friends, colleagues and others through the power of sharing a common

Robert Lashley was a 2016 Jack Straw Fellow, **Artist Trust** Fellow and Finalist for a **Stranger Genius** Award. In 2024, his first novel, I Never Dreamed You'd Leave In Summer, was

a finalist for a Washington State Book Award.

He also likes taking care of cats. Dr. Alassane Abdoulaye Dia of Western Washington University calls Robert's novel, "A striking and poignant perspective on contemporary America [...] will undoubtedly become a significant part of the African American literary canon."



GOLDEN APPLE AWARD WINNERS

WCLS's Youth Services staff will honor three Whatcom County educators at a 2 p.m. mainstage ceremony. WCLS began the Golden Apple Educator Award in 2007 to honor the dedication of local teachers and school staff who connect students with library resources that further their growth and learning.

Jennifer Bailey

is a multilingual **English learner** specialist at **Nooksack Valley** High School. Jennifer's main role is to support



the academic needs of her students as they develop as learners and readers, in both English and their native languages. She invites WCLS staff into her classroom to share about ConnectED and to school events like Hispanic Heritage Family Night to make sure her students' families know how to access the many books and other resources available to them from the public library. ConnectED is the county library system's partnership with local school districts that enables students to use their school ID as a library card.

Nicolle Klander is the librarian at Everson Elementary School. She is constantly looking for ways to connect students with



reading and uses the public library to fill in gaps when the school library doesn't have the books she wants to recommend. Following the 2021 flood that displaced Sumas students, the **Everson Elementary School Library** became a classroom so those students could continue attending classes in their own district. Despite the lack of a library space, Nicolle found new ways to deliver library services to students, including asking WCLS to bring the bookmobile to the school.

Tom Maxim

is a reading and math intervention specialist at Blaine Primary and Elementary School. Following the closure of the Blaine



Elementary Library, Tom recognized the urgent need for students to have access to quality reading materials. He reached out to the Blaine Library to arrange monthly delivery of library books to scores of classrooms. Since its launch last spring, this program successfully circulated over 1,000 books through Blaine Elementary School and has expanded this year to Blaine Primary School.


